

Why is Gender Equity important in Early Childhood?

- 1. Effective promotion of children's learning and development
 - How we contribute to their world: language, toys, materials, books, displays, music...
- 2. Intrinsically linked to NQF, EYLF practice principles and learning outcomes
 - 'Equity and Diversity', 'High Expectations for Every Child', 'Respectful Relationships and Responsive Engagement'





3. Positive Impact on Workplace Culture

- Role-modelling Equal and Respectful Relationships
- Policy Framework
 - Workplace Response to Family Violence Policy
 - Interactions with Children Policy
 - Workplace Flexibility Norms

What does equality look like in Early Childhood?




At the most micro level, discrimination impedes girls and women from achieving their individual hopes and dreams.

- Statement in all Position Descriptions regarding gender equity
- Audit of books, resources, play spaces
- Evaluated our philosophy, policies

- Conscious use of language in written
- Marketing and communications mater
- Understand gender inequity hot spots

Educators have an understanding about gender equity, unconscious bias, the importance of positive role models, and avoiding or eliminating negative stereotypes.





Understanding Why...

'Not only are they playing with only half the toys, they do not spend much time playing with children who are interested in other toys and begin to see each other as opposites.'



'This perception of differences and segregation continue throughout development. That means that early toy play has an impact on social relationships across the genders.'




