## **Evidence**

"We all need to support parents to create and model an environment for their children that promotes gender equality and gives children the freedom to be themselves. 5 Evidence Paper Executive Summary Importantly, the survey showed that the majority of parents want to take action to challenge traditional gender stereotypes. There are a number of ways in which parents of young children can do this, such as by being aware of the ways they may unintentionally and subtly reinforce gender stereotypes and by modelling gender equality and respect in their own relationships."

The 2018 Our Watch report suggests that by the age of two, children have already begun learning and demonstrating 'gender-role' behaviours, which are then further developed throughout their preschool years. Although nearly 80% of Australian parents would like to challenge gender stereotypes, nearly 60% of parents believe their children are not influenced by these stereotypes.









## How do we engage families?

- Allocate tasks based on skill












