A project to create connections between the aged and young.

The InterG pilot was devised as a five week trail adapted from the more common approach between kinder children and residents in aged care as currently viewed on the ABC programme;

"Old people's home for 4 year olds."





Recruitment of volunteers for the pilot

Our partner, Star Heath had an established volunteer program and oversaw the recruitment of the four volunteers for the program.

The process included: volunteer role description promotion of the program to existing volunteers and to the broader community police and WWC check one on one interviews registration, once successful, to the volunteer program

Bubup Role

to pilot the project

work with the kindergarten children and teachers to integrate the pilot into the curriculum.

will provide liaison on the day

provide data about the project objectives where necessary.



Initial data collected from some of the children

The children were asked a series of questions to gain some base line data Rather than ask what do you know about old people, which I believe is prejudicial, I asked

"I want you to think about what you know about people who have had lots and lots of birthdays"

"my grandma, she is very wise, she knows a lot of things
my grandma had a birthday at my house and my little
brother ran away
she is very wise, she knows how to make people happy
they have wrinkly skin, because they are very old
they are going to heaven
they are different people"
